
PRUNING



Pruning trees is vital to their health and beauty and your safety.

Prune for Safety

- Remove dead, weak or narrow-angled branches that can easily fall and cause injury or property damage.
- Trim branches that interfere with line of sight on streets or driveways.
- For limbs that are growing into street lights or utility lines, **DO NOT** attempt to prune them yourself. Contact your utility company or city maintenance workers to remove them.

Prune for Tree Health

- Remove limbs damaged by storms, disease or insect-infestation.
- Remove branches that cross or rub together.
- Thin the crown to increase light penetration and air movement.

Prune for Beauty

- Remove co-dominate stems to improve the tree's overall appearance.
- Trim sucker growth or unwanted branches.
- Prune to encourage flower and/or fruit development.

What's the best time of year to prune? For many trees in Central Florida, winter is the best time to prune. In the dry, cooler months, growth slows down and some trees shed their leaves making it easier to see problem branches.
